But by stopping the intended war at this point, the Labor Committees have gained vital time and cut, ever so slightly, the massive edge which Rockefeller has over the working class in the overall correlation of class forces.

FRIEDRICHS AND SIMON WAGE PSYWAR IN MOSCOW

Oct. 18 OIPS)--Moscow played host in the past week to two leading emissaries from the Rockefeller cabal: U.S. Secretary of the Treasury William Simon and West German Economic Minister Hans Friedrichs. Ostensibly engaged in serious economic negotiations, both delegations conducted themselves to create confusion about detente for the Soviets.

Friedrichs was accompanied by Trilateral Commission member Otto Wolff von Amerongen, who had just carried out a similar mission to Poland the previous week. Friedrichs and Amerongen praised the development of East-West trade in general, but hedged on actual agreements for credit. In discussions of the possible joint construction by the Soviet Union and West Germany of a nuclear (fission) power plant in Kaliningrad, Friedrichs announced the condition that West Berlin be included in the plant's electric power grid. Raising the Berlin question in this form immediately introduces a cold-war chill into the Russians' detente fantasy.

Since Friedrichs was laying the groundwork for West German Chancellor Schmidt's upcoming visit to the Soviet Union (which the misguided Russians mark as a big event on the detente calendar), the Friedrichs-Amerongen group sowed considerable confusion.

Smiling Simon

Simon, on the other hand, was all smiles and assured newsmen that the Soviet negotiators "share my optimism." After sweet-talking Soviet Foreign Trade Minister Patolichev for three days, Simon returned to Washington and announced that he and President Ford will be reconsidering the recently revoked permission for grain sales to the Soviet Union. The anti-Soviet move initially was dictated by Nelson Rockefeller to UPI editors two weeks ago in San Francisco. The hint of reversing this major move against the Soviet Union is classic hard cop/soft cop psychological warfare.

Under this kind of strain, Leonid Brezhnev struck out wildly against his tormentors. Speaking on the occasion of the U.S.-Soviet Economic and Trade Cooperation Council talks, he growled harshly that the Soviet Union will not tolerate the introduction of extraneous issues (such as Soviet emigration policies) into trade negotiations. But Simon smiled and mildly restated his optimism.

It was learned today that President Ford and Senator Henry Jackson's Congressional "emigration lobby" have reached a compromise, which assumes Soviet concession of a more than 50 per cent rise in emigration. The message to Brezhnev is clear: Growl what you will, but we make the decisions.

TRILATERAL COMMISSION RAILROADS NERA CONGRESSIONAL HEARINGS,
SUPPRESSES LABOR PARTY TESTIMONY

DETROIT, Oct. 18 (IPS)--Pete Signorelli, U.S. Labor Party candidate for Governor of Michigan, and Joe Spinola, Labor Party candidate for President of Teamsters Local 299, presented evidence on the fascist nature of the National Employment Priorities Act this morning at public Congressional hearings on the bill in Detroit. In particular, the two Labor Party candidates focused their testimony on exposing the sponsorship of the Act by Rockefeller's fascist planning body, the Trilateral Commission.

The Act would establish the National Employment Relocation Administration (NERA), in order to round up the masses of workers left jobless by the Rockefellers' calculated manipulations of food, fuel, and materials supplies and force their relocation to labor-intensive energy and other "development" camps.

When the chairman of the hearings, Representative William Ford (D-Mich.), brought United Auto Workers International Executive Board member Bard Young to the speakers' podium, Signorelli intervened to point out that Young was speaking on behalf of Rockefeller's Trilateral Commission, not auto workers. Signorelli then briefed the gathering for ten minutes on the fascist content of the NERA bill, followed by a five minute presentation by Spinola to the small audience of labor bureaucrats and middle-level politicians.

Senator Walter Mondale (D-Minn.), Trilateral Commission member and sponsor of the bill, sat paralyzed with a frozen grin during the Labor Party briefing. Unable to contradict Signorelli and Spinola, Mondale and Ford were silent even when Spinola indicted the NERA bill's Congressional sponsors as Nuremberg criminals for crimes against humanity. Finally Ford ordered deputy marshals quietly to evict the Labor Party organizers so that the bogus hearings could go on undisturbed.

The entire testimony, including the eviction of Labor Party spokesmen from today's hearings, was filmed by national network TV--ABC, CBS, and NBC.

In recent weeks this Commission, the Rockefeller brothers' international policy-making body of CIA labor, government, and business agents, secretly has been briefing politicians and labor-traitor bureaucrats in order to smooth the way for passage and implementation of NERA's fascist labor projects.
