

STRAUSS CALLS FOR EUROPEAN NATO AGAINST SOVIETS

Nov. 4 (IPS)--Franz-Josef Strauss, the Nazi chairman of the West German Christian Social Union based in Bavaria, explicitly endorsed the Trilateral Commission's military strategy for Europe yesterday in an interview with the French weekly magazine Le Point.

Strauss, whom Leonid Brezhnev branded a "revanchist"--one who wants to return to Nazism--during the recent visit of West German Chancellor Helmut Schmidt to Moscow, proposed that NATO be "subdivided into two distinct, independent sections--one American and the other European." According to Strauss, "even though the only power the Soviet Union respects is the U.S.A., Europe cannot continue to hang on the Americans' coattails." Instead, Strauss advocated the Trilateral Commission's policy to "Finlandize"--or neutralize--Western Europe, thus attempting to force the Soviet Union to accept a parallel "Finlandization" of Eastern Europe. This concept of "Finlandization" was laid out by CIA columnist C. L. Sulzberger in the New York Times today.

With Trilateral Commission policy coming from rabid anti-communist Strauss, the reality of the Barbarossa operation now underway against the Soviets is clear. In view of the distinct possibility of a Schmidt/Strauss coalition government in West Germany, the Soviets also must face the spectre of having to deal with Strauss himself in military matters.

VILLA SERBELLONI: ROCKEFELLER'S FULL-TIME SPOOK HOUSE

Nov. 4 (IPS)--The Villa Serbelloni, scene of the secret Trilateral Commission meeting three weeks ago, is apparently a full-time spook house. When covens of Rockefeller planners are not haunting the premises, CIA "Covert Operations" chief Henry Cord Meyer uses the secluded retreat in Bellagio, Italy to write studies of Nazi Germany.

Meyer, who made headlines in the beginning of 1974 when he was shipped to Britain to oversee the CIA's preparations for a military coup there, used a Villa Serbelloni dateline in the acknowledgements section of his book The Long Generation: Germany's Road to Ruin. The book, published in 1972 by Harper and Row, presents source material on the brainwashing of the German working class from 1914 to 1945, a process which Meyer and his masters are currently duplicating worldwide.
