

UAW PULLS LEADING GOONS FROM DETROIT PLANT FOR BRAINWASHING RETREAD

DETROIT, Nov. 4 (IPS)--Jesse Gregory, United Auto Workers local president and one-time chief goon against the U.S. Labor Party at the Ford Woodhaven Stamping plant here, has been pulled out of the plant and sent to the UAW's Black Lake Brainwashing Center for rewiring as a result of the Labor Party's counter-harassment campaign.

Gregory, who is known as "Joyboy" at his plant, along with the entire local UAW bureaucracy, was shipped off to Black Lake the day after angry workers at Woodhaven slammed him up against a wall and told him he was through harassing Labor Party organizers. UAW President Woodcock and his labor lieutenants, who monitor the success of Labor Party nationwide organizing at least daily, knew that Gregory no longer could be relied upon to keep workers in line and decided he needed a refresher course.

Last week Gregory showed up with 18 goons at a Labor Party campaign rally led by Labor Party candidate for Governor of Michigan Pete Signorelli. Four squads of police in riot gear mysteriously arrived at the same moment and arrested Signorelli for breach of the peace as soon as he announced, "This is a Labor Party campaign rally."

Coming after a month-long Labor Party campaign against Gregory's thuggery, that incident precipitated a feverish in-plant debate on the Labor Party which climaxed when the workers put Gregory up against the wall. Immediately afterwards, active anti-Woodcock caucuses in the plant called Labor Party offices to say that they would work to get out the Labor Party vote on election day. The next day, as Gregory and his goons departed for Black Lake, a Woodhaven worker came to the Labor Party office to report that workers throughout the plant were discussing "The Party." He then invited Labor Party organizers into the plant to conduct a rally in the cafeteria.

Only a few weeks ago, Labor Party organizers were selling only four copies of New Solidarity per distribution at Woodhaven as a result of Gregory's harassment. The Labor Party launched its successful counterattack with a leaflet entitled "Corporativism in the Flesh," which exposed Joyboy's "profit-sharing" arrangement with the management for the favors of a young lady.

Enraged, Gregory went berserk and started rooting through plant garbage cans for copies of the leaflet in a futile effort to find out who was distributing it inside the plant. Since then this pathetic macho has blundered from one psychotic outburst to the next, while the workers he once terrorized have begun to realize their capacity to fight Woodcock and Rockefeller.

Workers eager to master the principles behind the Labor Party's successful psychological warfare campaign are reportedly now circulating in the Woodhaven plant copies of "Beyond Psychoanalysis," Labor Party Chairman Lyn Marcus' groundbreaking essay on Marxian psychology.
