whore that is driven through the village. Under this guise, everything that is still somewhat normal here, that maintains the landscape, that operates clean pasture management, that operates clean agriculture, is destroyed. It's destroying family farms, it's destroying

everything. It's actually just *causing* more hunger. And every year, 70 million more are added.

I can't think of anything else. I wanted to bring this addendum, but now I really have to go back to the barn.

Hello! I'm Bob Baker, with the Schiller Institute. I'm in Kansas, at the Kansas Cattleman's Association state convention.


