

problem is, in one sense, pedagogical. How can people be induced to do that which they desire, yet believe themselves unable to achieve? That is where the Classical principle and method of creativity, whether applied in the field of drama, music or the plastic arts, can dispel tragedy by discovering and revealing, if only by implication, a new physical principle of action never before experienced or portrayed in that unique way.

The pursuit of happiness (a world harmony of interests) by the deliberate increase, through scientific and technological progress, in the potential relative population-density of the planet's human population, can be the unifying mission of a newly organized community of principle, that will form the basis of what Franklin Delano Roosevelt wanted for the world, at the end of

World War II, embodied in what should have become the United Nations.

The post-colonial reorganization of that United Nations body; the just restructuring of the international monetary system; the reinstatement of the Glass-Steagall separation of human from zombie banking practices; the revolution, not in military affairs, but in medical science and universal health care; and the recognition of the Global Development Initiative, the Global Security Initiative, the Global Health Initiative and the Global Civilization Initiative as in the interests of humanity, and therefore in the interest of all nations, is the mission for which LaRouche qualified his associates, and for which his associates must now qualify the world.
